Lock Down Practice

Tomorrow Wednesday 21st August our school will be involved in our annual Lock Down exercise practice. Our school has again used Harrison Tew, who specialise in emergency management planning for schools to run this practice. The procedures developed by Harrison Tew allow us to respond safely and quickly to a range of circumstances.

As a component of the implementation of the emergency procedures into our school, specialised training is being conducted with senior leadership and our staff. The students will also receive training directed at their respective age groups from Harrison Tew-

The training consists of a low key but detailed approach to potential threats and has been successfully implemented in hundreds of schools throughout New Zealand.

After the training, we will be conducting a lock down exercise under the guidance and support of Harrison Tew. The exercise will be as real-life as possible, which will mean that parents/families will receive notification by way of the school website and Facebook page. The information passed on will emphasise that this is an exercise/practice and will explain that all updated information will then be posted on the school website/Facebook Page.

Prior to this occurring, can I please remind all parents and caregivers to ensure your contact details (mobile phone numbers and email addresses) are current as this will be our communication with you, should an emergency occur at the school.

In a genuine incident, should you hear of a lock down or evacuation at the school, can I please ask that you do not attend the school or phone, as we will not be able to respond.

Your presence at, or contact with, the school may make it more difficult for us to manage the situation and could potentially place your children and, in fact, yourselves at risk.

Education Review Visit

On **Monday 23rd September** to **Friday 27th August** our school will be visited by the Education Review Office. The visit will be an external evaluation on how the school is progressing. They will have the opportunity to talk to the Board, staff, students and parents about our school and look at things we are doing well with and areas that we can improve on.

We will open the visit with our school powhiri on Monday 23rd August starting at **9:00am**. Parents and whanau are welcome to attend our powhiri during this time. We look forward to having the Education Review Team here at Manurewa South School in Week 10.

School Attendance

School attendance and lateness can be a concern in schools. There is evidence that those children who are at school every day make better learning gains to those who have irregular attendance. Here at Manurewa South School, we expect your child to be at school **every day**. If your child needs to be away then they are required to bring a note, or a phone call needs to be made before or on their return. The new law allows for truancy officers to fine parents for children who are absent from school without a reasonable explanation. Our Social Worker and Truancy Agency will also support the school and follow up any irregular attendance.

NOTE: If a child's attendance is causing concern then the schools Social Worker will visit families/whanau to find out why and what we can do to get them back to school as soon as possible – if we are unable to get any response then unfortunately the schools truancy office will then visit families. Please ensure that your child is at school every day and that they are on time ready to learn. Remember – **"EVERYDAY COUNTS!"**

Whanau Aspiration Surveys

Measles Outbreak Information

As you will be aware Auckland and New Zealand is experiencing a measles outbreak with over 500 cases now recorded. We ask that you remain vigilant on symptoms and act on them straight away.

If your child is not vaccinated due to previous reaction or by parental choice then they will be at high risk. The advice from the Auckland Regional Public Health Service (ARPHS) is as follows: Symptoms.

The Measles will start with a fever, cough, runny nose and conjunctivitis (inflammation in the eyes) which may last 2-4 days. It may be possible to see small white spots (Koplik spots) inside the mouth. A rash will occur 2-4 days after the first symptoms beginning on the head and gradually spreading down the body to the arms and legs. This will last up to a week.

How do you catch measles?

Measles is spread through infectious droplets. It is airborne and one person with measles can easily pass the disease onto 12-18 people who are at risk. As the number of vaccinated people decreases, the herd (community) immunity drops, therefore leaving even those vaccinated at some risk.

Please be aware as required by the ARPHS that should the school have a confirmed case of measles all unimmunised students who have been in contact with that person will be placed in quarantine and must remain at home (possibly for 2 weeks). For more information please use the following:

Social Worker in Schools

Our school is very fortunate to have a Social Worker in School (SWiS) - Mrs Arina Aria. The work that our SWiS service provide are aimed at children and young people:

- who have poor engagement in school, as a result of social problems
- with social or behavioural problems
- experiencing grief or loss
- who are from families who may be struggling financially
- with issues such as overcrowding, family violence, drug and alcohol etc.
- from at-risk families

While the Social Worker's primary focus is the child, they take a whole whanau/family approach, which may include working with siblings attending other schools.

Unfortunately some of our families (those who have children who fall into these categories) are reluctant to use this service because they think that our SWiS will refer them to Oranga Tamaki. That is not their intention at all, they are about working with and supporting children to ensure that their needs are being met.

Mathletics is a captivating online learning space providing students with all the tools they need to be successful learners, both in the classroom and beyond. We see many benefits in Mathletics and ask parents to encourage children to work on Mathletics at home daily for 30-60 minutes. Each child has their own individual password to access Mathletics.

TRAVELWISE NEWS

We seem to be having some minor issues with road safety practice on our school roads especially along Tawa Cres (front of the school). These are things like:

- Parking on the YELLOW lines
- Parking in the school grounds/driveways to drop children off or pick them up
- Parents calling children to cross the road without using the crossing
- Parents crossing the road not using the crossing

Our Travelwise team try very hard to make sure our children are safe around our roads and it doesn't help when parents are modelling these behaviours! If we continue to have incidents like these then we will be calling for the Community Constable to supervise this which will result in them issuing fines for those who are not following our road safety rules.

NOTE: If your child is bringing a bike to school they must wear a helmet. If they arrive to school without one they will not return home with their bike until a helmet is brought in.
